Three Buffalo Chapter members will perform in this year's recital as follows:

KOTOE SHIMOJO has been Director of Music Ministry at Clarence Presbyterian Church since 2009. She served formerly at First Presbyterian Church of East Aurora and Randall Baptist Church, Williamsville. Kotoe was born in Japan, and after coming to the U.S. she began her organ study in 1991. She earned a Bachelor of Music in organ performance at the University at Buffalo, a Master of Music degree in organ performance at the University of Alabama, and did further study with David Craighead at Eastman in Rochester. Kotoe is an accomplished choral conductor as well as keyboardist of classical music.

JAMES FLOOD has been Organist-Choir Director at First Baptist Church, Niagara Falls since 1988 and teaches organ, advanced piano, handbell ensemble, choral ensemble, and chamber choir at Villa Maria College in Buffalo. James was born in New England and came to Western New York in the early 1970's to work with a local pipe organ company and also did graduate organ study with Squire Haskin. He has served in several churches in Western New York, concertized extensively, conducted many choral and orchestral concerts, and has made two CD's on the organ at First Baptist Church.

RICHARD HERR has been Director of Music and Organist at Westminster Presbyterian Church, Buffalo since 1002. Prior to that he served for 31 years in a similar position at First Presbyterian Church, Tyler, Texas. He is currently serving on the Buffalo Chapter Executive Committee and is a past Dean of the East Texas Chapter AGO.
