

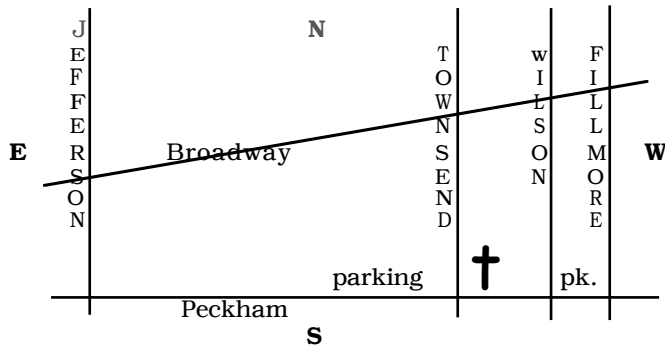
**NEXT EVENT continued . . .**

As well as performing recitals in St. Paul's Cathedral and Westminster Abbey, London, and in most major venues in New York City and at the National Cathedral in Washington, D.C., Andrew was a featured performer at the Royal Canadian College of Organists' National Convention in Winnipeg in 2004. Recent performances include solo recitals in New Jersey, Georgia, South Carolina, Nebraska, Ontario, at the historic Round Lake Auditorium in Upstate New York and at the Metropolitan Museum of Art in New York City. In November 2008 he was featured on a broadcast of MPR's Pipedreams, playing the U.S. premiere of a work by Barrie Cabena recorded live at MAPC in 2007. In the New York City area he is in demand for his collaborative organ and continuo playing, having appeared with the New York Philharmonic, American Symphony Orchestra, Musica Sacra Orchestra & Chorus and the Collegiate Chorale. Andrew has also been featured in performances with Grammy award-winning composer Paul Halley and organist Renée Anne Louprette, in a program entitled "Triptych" - featuring music written by Halley for the unusual but effective combination of organ, piano and harpsichord.

At Westminster Choir College he teaches graduate courses in organ literature, concentrating on North German and French classical organ literature, as well as on the organ works of J. S. Bach. Dr. Henderson is also the organ instructor at Teacher's College, Columbia University. A Fellow of the Royal Canadian College of Organists, his teachers have included John Tuttle, Barrie Cabena, David Sanger, Thomas Murray and John Weaver. Andrew is married to organist Mary Wannamaker Huff, who is the Associate Director of Music at Madison Avenue Presbyterian Church and Director of the Children's Choirs at the Church of St. Ignatius Loyola. Andrew and Mary have two young boys, Elliot and Christian. [from Andrew's web site]
